The Downs Speedway club was originally established in 1966-67 when racing was held at the old Toowoomba Showgrounds and continued there until 1974 when the Royal Agricultural Society announced they would promote speedway themselves. The then members of the club voted to establish their own grounds and in May 1975 the land at Charlton was purchased and many hard-working dedicated people spent a lot of hours working to establish this great complex that we enjoy today. The Down Speedway Club's Charlton Raceway complex was opened on 23 April 1977.

The club ran and operated the venue successfully until the 2013/14 season when become privately promoted by Alan Woods who operated the venue for two seasons until he sold the lease to Made Too Go Pty Ltd (Barry Waldron) in 2015 for the 2015/16 season.



Kicking Up The Dirt – Thunder on the DownsBy Joanne White

Luke Oldfield got the win last night in the feature event for night one of the Menz Trading and Hire Thunder on the Downs at Hi-Tec Oils Toowoomba Speedway. Oldfield, who was win-less in the 2023-2024 race season, dominated from the drop of the green, weaved his way through heavy lapped traffic and was comfortable in charge for the entire thirty-lap journey. Lachlan McHugh and Brock Hallett had an almighty battle for second and third that captivated the crowd in the closing moments of the race. McHugh secured second ahead of Hallett, while Jock Goodyer and Matt Egel completed the top five.

Rain over Thursday night had initially cast doubt as to if the event would proceed as planned, but with the skies clearing track gates opened, competitors and fans alike poured into the venue. The field of 45 was split in half and qualifying got underway.

Flight one qualifying saw Brent Kratzmann set the mark early, the second car to hit the track stopping the clock at a quick 11.556 seconds. Kratzmann proved unbeatable for most of the session, until the second-last contender, Brock Hallett, hit the track. Hallett wasted no time taking the top qualifying spot, his 11.483 soon topping the flight one qualifying order, and, would also see him take top honours as the fastest qualifying lap of the night after flight two had been completed. Bent Kratzmann was second



fastest in flight one, ahead of Tate Frost, Ryan Newton and Matt Egel. Flight two saw Luke Oldfield and Kaiden Manders lead the qualifying order early, with a host of quality contenders to follow. In the end though it was popular Toowoomba local Tarhlea Apelt who put down a pair of faultless laps to stop the clock at 11.719 seconds and secure the top spot in flight two qualifying, as well as third fastest in the entire field. Luke Oldfield, Kaiden Manders, Lachlan McHugh and Jock Goodyer rounded out the fastest five in flight two. Overall, 37 of the 45 contenders were separated by less than one second, while Adam Butler had mechanical woes on board the Q10 racer and was unable to contest qualifying. Jordyn Brazier rode out a nasty wreck on his second qualifying lap, and, despite his first lap being enough for tenth in flight one, he would take no further part in the evening.

Brock Hallett and Ryan Newton led the field to green light conditions for the start of heat one, with Hallett securing the race lead ahead of Newton. Newton soon surrendered second to a determined Matt Egel, with Egel then challenging Hallett for the race lead. Egel soon led, while further back Queensland Champion Nicholas Whell searched for a way past former Queensland Champion Newton before Jordyn Charge joined the pair. The battle that followed as Newton and Charge traded places back and forth, taking turns sliding underneath one another several times a lap, truly captivated the crowd and was just a small preview of the type of racing that would follow all night. Brett Hobson soon closed in on Newton and Charge, while at the front Egel had opened a small lead only for Hallett to close back in in the final few laps of the race. With half a lap to run Hallett challenged for the lead, the pair batting it out all the way to the line, drag racing past the chequered flag, with Brock Hallett getting the win ahead of Matt Egel, Ryan Newton, Brett Hobson, Nicholas Whell, Jordyn Charge, Michael Saller, Aaron Kelly, Mick Sauer, Kinser Claridge and James Matthews.

Brent Kratzmann started heat two from pole position with Tate Frost alongside. Kratzmann secured the lead when the green flag flew with Brodie Davis soon getting the better of Frost and settling into second, but the race was soon brought to a stop when race leader Kratzmann drifted a little too high in turn four, clipped the wall and brought the race to a stop. While the Q2 racer was not quite right and had rear end damage, Kratzmann restarted the event at the tail of the field in a format where finishing position determines starting positions in the main events. With nine laps remaining Davis led the restart from Dylan Menz and Cody O'Connell. Davis was strong out in front while O'Connell displaced Menz to steal second, with Tate Frost following him through. Jayden Peacock began to advance before the race was brought under caution once more as James Kennedy and Brent Kratzmann came together at the tail of the field. Davis again led the restart from O'Connell and Frost, while Peacock, Jy Corbet and Jesse Schlotfeldt began trying to make their way forward from deep in the field. Brodie Davis got the win ahead of Tate Frost and Cody O'Connell, with Jayden Peacock fourth and Jy Corbet fifth after an epic side-by-side battle with Schlotfeldt. Jesse Schlotfeldt finished sixth and led Jackson Delamont, Charlie Bowen, Brent Kratzmann, Dylan Menz, Richie Robb and James Kennedy across the line.

Tarhlea Apelt and Lachlan McHugh led the heat three field to the green flag, with McHugh securing the lead only for the race to be stopped when Michael Pickens spectacularly inverted the Q74 racer after contact with Kaydon Iverson. While Pickens walked away from the crash his competition was over for the night. A full restart followed with McHugh again getting the better of Apelt when the green flag flew, with Jock Goodyer settling into third before challenging on the high side of Apelt in an effort to steal second. Apelt and Goodyer raced wheel-to-wheel for several laps, with Goodyer persistent on the top and Apelt steadfast and determined on the bottom, refusing to surrender the position. Behind them Marcus Dumesny and Callum Walker, in his return to Sprintcar racing, had a similar side-by-side battle with Dumesny eventually getting the better of the #23 racer. Apelt began to close in on McHugh and the race lead, with lapped traffic coming into play with just two laps to run. Lachlan McHugh got the win ahead of Tarhlea Apelt and Jock Goodyer, with Marcus Dumesny, Callum Walker, Kaydon Iverson, Steven Loader, Luke Manttan and Nathan Pronger rounding out the finishers. Michael Pickens did not finish the event.

The final heat of the night saw Luke Oldfield secure the lead from pole position with fellow front row starter Kaiden Manders settling into second but immediately coming under pressure from Michael Stewart. Stewart displaced Manders and began challenging Oldfield for the lead when the race was

brought under caution for the spun car of Anthony Lambert. With nine laps remaining Oldfield led the restart from Stewart and Manders, with Randy and Richard Morgan close behind. Oldfield soon settled into a comfortable lead before Stewart again closed in and had a big, but unsuccessful, look on the inside of Oldfield, while behind them Manders and Randy Morgan had a thrilling battle for third. Luke Oldfield went on to take the win ahead of Michael Stewart and Randy Morgan, with Kaiden Manders, Richard Morgan, Ashley Cook, Chad Ely, Ryan Potts and Anthony Lambert rounding out the finishers. Henry Titman, in his first Open Sprintcar race, withdrew to the infield and did not finish the event.

Despite being the second fastest car in qualifying, a less than ideal heat race result saw Brent Kratzmann start the C-Main from pole position. The Q2 racer was quick to secure the race lead when things got underway, with Mick Sauer settling in to second ahead of Anthony Lambert, while further back Dylan Menz committed to the top in an effort to advance. A caution soon followed when Richie Robb spun to a stop with eleven laps to run. Kratzmann led the restart from Sauer and Lambert, with Menz and Henry Titman close behind. Lambert soon faded while Kratzmann and Sauer ran away from the rest of the field, with Menz eventually closing in on the back of Sauer and the final transfer position with only a handful of laps to run. Brent Kratzmann got the win ahead of Mick Sauer, both transferring to the back of the B-Main event, with Dylan Menz, Kinser Claridge, James Kennedy, Nathan Pronger, James Matthews, Henry Titman and Anthony Lambert rounding out the finishers. Richie Robb did not finish the event.

The B-Dash saw Ryan Newton and Jock Goodyer lead the field to green light conditions, racing side-by-side until Newton was able to get his nose in front. Goodyer challenged on the top and soon got around Newton while both Randy Morgan and Kaiden Manders had a truly brilliant battle as they closed in on Newton, the trio captivating the crowd as Marcus Dumesny joined them from behind. The way the quartet traded places over the final few laps of the race thrilled the crowd, but it was Jock Goodyer who took the win ahead of Ryan Newton and Randy Morgan, with Marcus Dumesny, Kaiden Manders, Jayden Peacock, Cody O'Connell and Brett Hobson rounding out the finishers. The A Dash hit the track with Brock Hallett and Luke Oldfield from the front row, with Hallett securing the lead only for chaos to unfold behind when Brodie Davis got a touch sideways forcing the rest of the field to take evasive action. Tate Frost ended up stranded on the track with Matt Egel also involved and stopped, bringing the race under caution. A full restart followed with both Frost and Egel at the tail of the field and Goodyer elevated the fifth for the restart. Hallett again secured the lead ahead of Oldfield and McHugh, with Oldfield successfully challenging Hallett for control of the race. McHugh got the better of Hallett before Hallett raced back underneath the Australian Champion but contact between the pair would see McHugh loose ground and surrender a position to Goodyer, who soon challenged Hallett, searching the high line for a way past on the final lap. Luke Oldfield got the win ahead of Brock Hallett and Jock Goodyer, with Lachlan McHugh, Tate Frost, Matt Egel, Ryan Newton, Brodie Davis, Michael Stewart and Tarhlea Apelt rounding out the finishers.

A star-studded B-Main hit the track with Nicholas Whell and Richard Morgan leading them to race conditions. Whell secured the lead ahead of Morgan, Jordyn Charge and Jy Corbet while Jesse Schlotfeldt soon advanced to third leaving Morgan in the final transfer position. Callum Walker began advancing, while Whell led comfortably out in front, approaching lapped traffic with eleven laps remaining. Charge closed in on Whell in lapped traffic, while Jackson Delamont and Callum Walker continued an impressive run forward, both making their way inside the top four. Delamont displaced Charge for second, with Charge soon surrendering third to a determined Walker as the laps wore on. The battle for the lead began to heat up as both Delamont and Walker closed on Whell, with Delamont getting the lead only for Whell and Walker to challenge for control. The trio crossed the line three abreast with all eyes then turning to the time board to discover who actually made it there first. Nicholas Whell took the win just 0.002 seconds ahead of Callum Walker with Jackson Delamont in third. Jordyn Charge come home in fourth and secured the final transfer to the main event. Jesse Schlotfeldt in his debut with the Motorguard Motorsport team crossed the line fifth and led Aaron Kelly, Ashley Cook, Kaydon Iverson, Brent Kratzmann, Jy Corbet, Michael Saller, Chad Ely, Mick Sauer, Luke Manttan, Steven Loader and Ryan Potts across the line. Richard Morgan and Charlie Bowen both failed to finish the event.

The A-Main event saw Luke Oldfield and Brock Hallett share the front row, with Oldfield quick to secure the lead when the lights went green. Hallett slid underneath as they rounded the second turn and moved into the race lead, only for the race to be brought under caution when things got very messy mid field on the back straight. A full restart followed, the race running non-stop from there. Oldfield secured the lead when the race resumed, with Hallett settling into second as Oldfield began to open a comfortable lead. Tate Frost made his way underneath Jock Goodyer as they negotiated over top five positions, only for Goodyer to quickly regain the advantage as Brodie Davis had a quick but unsuccessful look underneath them both. Frost and Davis traded places while Oldfield continued to lead comfortably from Hallett and Lachlan McHugh. With twenty-two laps still to run lapped traffic came into play, allowing McHugh to close in on Hallett and the pair to edge a fraction closer to Oldfield as the Q17 tried to navigate very heavy traffic. Oldfield made is look easy as he weaved his way through the back-markers as they raced each other two abreast for minor positions. Hallett and McHugh were left to battle the traffic and each other as they negotiated over second with McHugh eventually taking over second and relegating Hallett to third. Oldfield continued to extend his lead, while the whole field put on an exceptional show with plenty of two, three and even four wide racing on occasion right through the field. McHugh and Hallett closed slightly on Oldfield went on to take the win, his first in over a year, with Lachlan McHugh home in

second and Brock Hallett rounding out the podium. Jock Goodyer and Matt Egel rounded out the top five, with Michael Stewart, Ryan Newton, Jackson Delamont, Tate Frost, Brodie Davis, Jayden Peacock, Randy Morgan, Callum Walker, Kaiden Manders, Marcus Dumesny, Jordyn Charge, Cody O'Connell, Tarhlea Apelt, Nicholas Whell and Brett Hobson rounding out the finishers. All twenty starters finished the nearly non-stop affair.

We were initially scheduled to return for night two tonight, which was then postponed until tomorrow, due to rain at the venue. However despite a much finer forecast for tomorrow, continued rain has already drenched the venue and forced the cancellation of even tomorrow's rain date. Sadly that gives Night Two of the Menz Trading and Hire Thunder on the Downs to Mother Nature.

The fans of the Hi-Tec Oils Toowoomba Speedway are in for a feast of Speedcar racing during the 2024-25 season.

The GSA Advanced Machining Series Ultimate Speedcar Championship returns with a four round competition beginning on November 2. A big thank you to Brad and Toni Dawson of GSA Advanced Machining for their continued support of Queensland Speedcar racing. The Queensland Speedcar Championship returns to Toowoomba on December 28, and it will be the seventeenth time this event has been held at this track since it opened. The first occasion was 1981 and it was won by Danny Davidson who we honour tonight with his memorial race.

Davidson won many big races including the Australian Speedcar Grand Prix, state titles in two states and wins at the old Sydney Showground which was no easy feat. He died from cancer in 2000. Tonight's race is generously sponsored by Ian Boettcher Race Parts.

One new event for the season is the 50 lapper which will be on the final night of the season on May 17. This has been an annual event on the calendar for many years but hasn't been run since the closure of the Archerfield track in Brisbane in 2023. \$5,000 will go to the winner plus any lap sponsor money that will be available to the leader of each lap. It is a big event and is usually well supported by interstate drivers.

Pre-season practice nights have seen many teams test their cars for the new season and it showed that they are locked and ready to go racing.


